INTRODUCTION

This is New Zealand’s first Coalition Policy Options Guide. It shows how voters view policy in 15 major areas, ranging from climate change management, to skills, health and taxation reform.

It details results for 149 principles or policy options.

Each option is given a 0 to 11 level of agreement score with 11 representing agreement to the proposition by all parties and 0 meaning consistent disagreement with the proposition contained in the question across all parties.

The guide is drawn from Shape NZ research over the past 2 years. It is a significant reference work for those with a vital interest in the policies which may be agreed in any post general election coalition or supply arrangements.

The New Zealand Business Council for Sustainable Development, whose 74 member companies’ annual sales of more than \$44 billion equate to more than 37% of gross domestic product in dollar value – aims to mainstream sustainable practice.

The Business Council believes sustainable business must be profitable, but also take care of the environment and people.

It researches to find practicable solutions for major long-term issues facing New Zealand.

Voter support is analysed on major issues New Zealand must address if it is not only to grow sustainably, but also preserve and improve New Zealanders’ quality of life.









LEVEL OF AGREEMENT SCORE

A level of agreement score, of 0 to 11, is provided with each policy.

This reports the combined total of voters for each party, and undecided voters or those who prefer not to say or not to vote, on each policy.

A score is provided on those agreeing with a policy, or disagreeing.

Where there are several policy options, or no clear majority support for an option, a result is provided based on a more agree than disagree basis being expressed as a yes and the opposite being a no.

METHODOLOGY

The Coalition Policy Options Guide brings together results from 15 national polls conducted by the Business Council-owned ShapeNZ research service between November, 2006, and July, 2008.

ShapeNZ at August 1, 2008, had 14,213 members, of whom all but about 1000 were recruited using purchased e-mail lists. ShapeNZ members register and provide demographic and previous party vote information to ensure results can be accurately weighted to reflect the New Zealand population compared with the 2006 census and 2005 general election result.

All results are weighted by up to six criteria, including age, gender, employment status, personal income, ethnicity and party vote 2005, to ensure respondent samples are representative. A report on ShapeNZ methodology may be downloaded from the web at www.nzbcscd.org.nz/story.asp?id=874

Maximum margins of error, at a 95% confidence level, are calculated for each survey. In the surveys used in this guide respondent numbers vary from 480, in the earliest survey, to 6198. The maximum margins of error therefore range from +/- 4.5% to 1.7% on the national sample.
