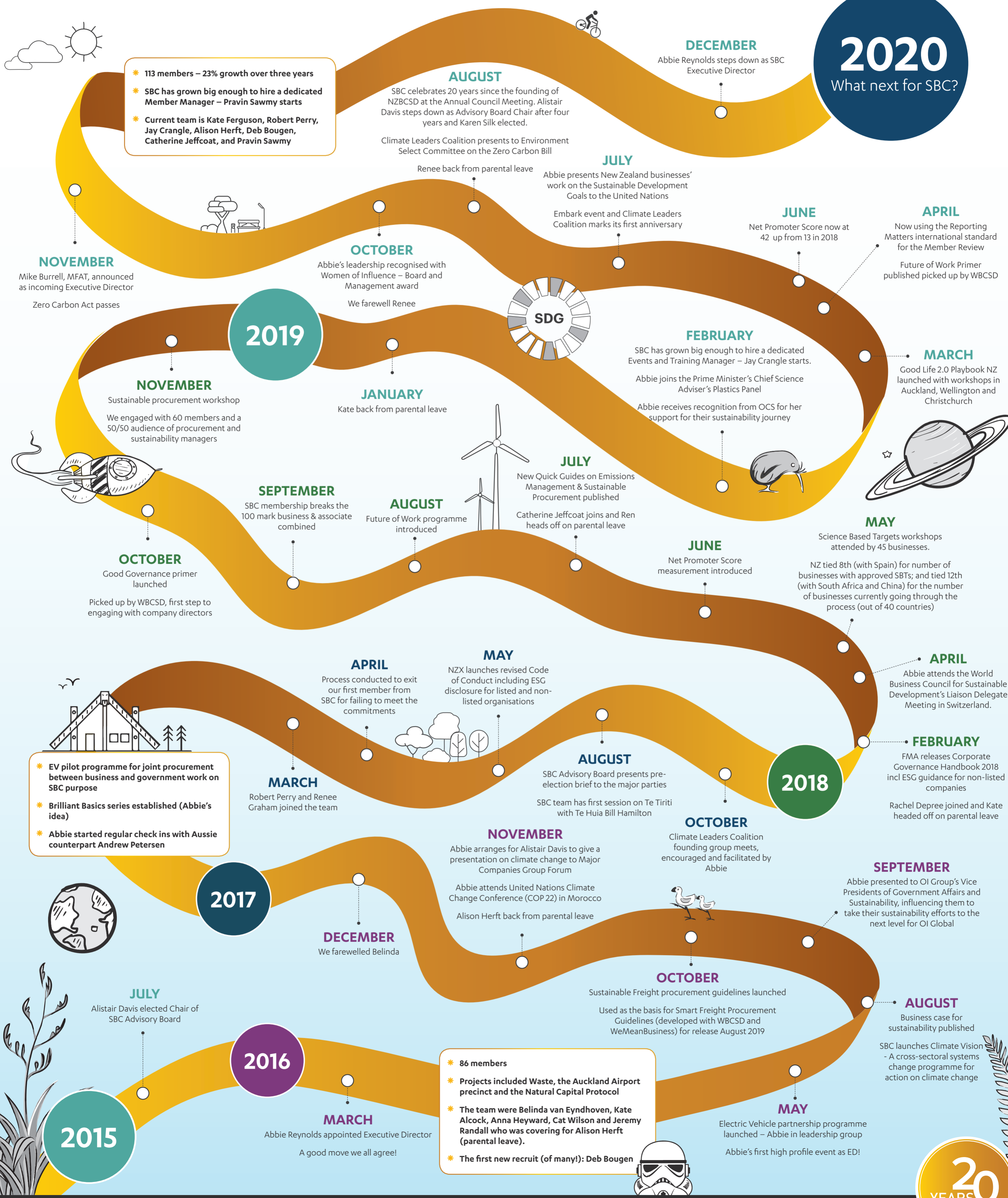


SBC achievements during Abbie Reynolds' leadership

 Abbie receives recognition from OCS for her support for their sustainability journey

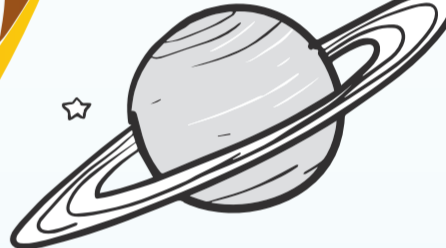
